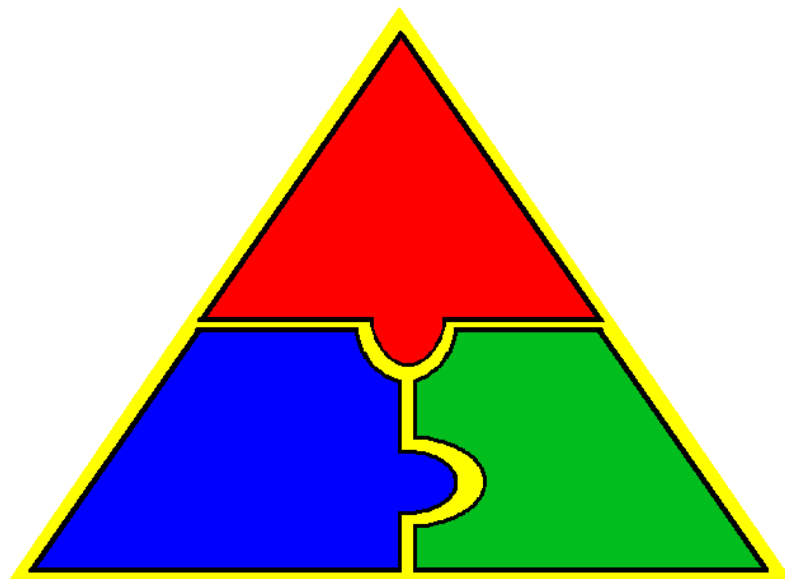

Ysgol Maes Y Mynydd

The school is an all through primary setting catering for children from Nursery age up to age 11 of both sexes. Children are taught through the medium of English with a strong emphasis on Bilingualism. The main language of the school is English.

FOUNDATION LEARNING

The Foundation Learning caters for children between the ages of 3-7 years.

Funded Early Education is available in the Spring and Summer term for children whose 3rd birthday falls between 1st September and the start of the Summer term.

The Nursery provision is available for the full three terms for children whose 3rd birthday is on or before 31st August. This is currently 5 sessions (mornings) per week.

Pupils are admitted to Reception in the year they attain their 4th birthday i.e. between 1st September and 31st August the following year.

Children are grouped in one Nursery class (a.m.), one Reception and Year 1 classes and two Year 2 classes.

KEY STAGE 2

Key Stage 2 are currently grouped into 5 classes from Year 3 to Year 6.

The organisation of classes can vary from year to year depending on the number of children in each year group.

Snack

As we are part of the Welsh Healthy Schools Scheme, we must follow Welsh Government 'Appetite for Life' Guidelines and offer pupils a healthy snack daily.

This will be milk (Foundation Phase only) and water to drink and fruit to eat.

The cost for fruit is currently £1.50 per week for all pupils. This is payable weekly in advance on ParentPay.

Parents who do not wish their children to have snack from school are asked to send in a 'healthy snack' in line with school policy.

Personal, Social and Health Education

It is the policy of the Governing Body and the school that sex and relationships education and drugs awareness are to be regarded as part of a developing curriculum of personal and social education. Care is taken to sensitively match teaching to the maturity of the pupils. They are taught as part of a wider personal and social education programme. Various aspects are also dealt with in environmental studies, science, PE etc. Parents will be given details of the Sex Education Curriculum prior to implementation. Written consent is required from the parent/carer.

Curriculum and Teaching

The curriculum for Wales became statutory in September 2022. The framework provides an integrated approach to learning and teaching. The curriculum is purpose led not content led. The 6 areas uphold the 4 purposes which are outlined in the Appendix 1. There are 6 areas of learning which are Health and Wellbeing, Humanities, Languages, Literacy and Communication, Mathematics and Numeracy, Science and Technology. Throughout these areas the school provides opportunities for literacy, numeracy and digital competency to be taught following the relevant frameworks.

The Framework helps practitioners develop a more integrated approach to learning. The six Areas bring together familiar disciplines and encourage strong and meaningful links across them. Those individual disciplines still play an important role, especially as learner's progress and begin to specialise.

The Curriculum for Wales guidance promotes collaboration and cross-disciplinary planning, learning and teaching, both within and across Areas. This will enable learners to build connections across their learning and combine different experiences, knowledge and skills.

Children with Additional Learning Needs

We are determined to deliver a fully inclusive education system for our learners. We are continuously creating a system where needs are identified early and addressed quickly, and where all learners are supported to reach their potential.

We want to make sure that:

- children and their parent's views, wishes and feelings are listened to when decisions are being made about how to help children
- the right support is put in place quickly to help children with ALN
- everyone works together to help children with ALN, including education and health services
- most children with ALN can go to their local maintained setting if it is right for them
- children and their families can access learning support even before they start school
- children and their parents understand the additional learning provision (ALP) being offered
- if children and their parents are not happy with decisions about ALN, there are rights in law to help them do something about it

The school was remodelled in 2008 and has facilities such as wider access doors, disabled toilets with shower facilities, ramps and a lift to cater for pupils with disability should the need arise.

Applications to join the school for those with a disability should be made through admissions in the Local Authority.

Assessment

The school has an assessment policy and children's progress is regularly monitored during the school year. This takes the form of the teacher's own assessment of ongoing class work, pupil self-assessment and formal testing. Assessment is used to find out what your child has learnt and where he/she needs to go next.

There are national requirements for the assessment of pupils throughout the academic year through national literacy and numeracy tests. Pupils in years 2 to 6 undertake these assessments twice across the academic year. Nursery and Reception pupils are assessed within the first seven weeks of entering school to provide a baseline for their progress.

Equal Opportunities and Race Equality

We recognise that Equal Opportunities is about individuals of both sexes, young and old fulfilling their potential and making choices in their lives, unhampered by expectations based on stereotyping. We also promote good relations between members of different racial, cultural and religious groups and communities to ensure there is no discrimination.

Parental Involvement in learning

We place a great deal of importance on the promotion of parents and school working in partnership to ensure that each child achieves his/her potential.

We try to encourage parents/carers to be involved in a child's reading programme through taking reading books home on a regular basis and listening to your child(ren) reading regularly. Homework will be given as and when appropriate to consolidate work covered in class. Pupils may be asked to follow up projects being carried out in school and may be asked to bring things in to develop these projects. We ask for your support in these links and are happy to discuss any concerns or questions you may have.

Should you wish to discuss any area of your child's progress or need advice, the staff are only too willing to meet you at any time given prior notice of a convenient time for both parent/carer and teacher. Teachers are available between 8.40 a.m. and 8.50 a.m. each morning or at the end of the school day.

Information sessions are planned providing the opportunity to find out about aspects of school life and see them implemented in classes.

In a normal week, the hours spent on actual teaching are required to be 21.5 hours, Foundation Phase and 23 hours, Key Stage 2. This excludes breaks, registration and collective worship.

Website

An app is also available for our website which is free and compatible with Apple and Android devices and allows you to receive alerts, read about school news, view & subscribe to the school's calendar and more. MCAS

'My Child at School' also referred to as MCAS is available for both iOS and Android devices and allows us to contact parents/carers with important school messages and share school documents. You will also be able to see the personal information we hold about you and your child; you may update this information, at any time, which helps keep our records up to date. Parent's evenings will also run through MCAS.

It also has a parent App which runs on iOS and Android which allows parents to easily report student absence and receive announcements and letters from school electronically.

Please note: A current email address must be registered with the school. If you have not already provided us with an email address, please ask at the main office for a form to complete.

Educational visits/charging and remissions

Details of all activities are forwarded to you in writing prior to any visit out of school. The 1988 Education Act stated that no child should be excluded from educational visits on the grounds of inability to contribute, however we do not have any budget to fund trips. While we try to minimise the costs by subsidising these visits when we can, if insufficient contributions are received the activity unfortunately cannot go ahead.

Visits are arranged to enhance the pupils' work in school and planned accordingly. We aim to inform you of any costs well in advance and try to spread the visits / activities out over the year. The school has a charging policy that can be viewed on the school website. Trips are paid for using ParentPay.

Parents' Evenings

We hold Parents' Evenings in the Autumn and Summer terms. This is an opportunity for you to meet your child's teacher, to discuss progress and view your child's work.

In the summer term parents/carers receive annual written reports to discuss progress, attendance, behaviour etc.

Parents/carers can also view their child's work. If you have any concerns, please contact the school and staff will contact you should they deem it necessary.

Please make every effort to attend these evenings, as they are important to you as parents/carers and also to your child who likes to know that someone is viewing their hard work and progress throughout the year. Appointments can be made with the class teacher prior to the meetings.

After School Activities

A range of extra-curricular activities take place after school. Details and arrangements regarding these activities will be sent to you. They may vary from year to year and from class to class.

Before, After School and Holiday provision

The school operates out of school care before and after school and during school holidays.

Breakfast Club

The Breakfast Club operates under the Welsh Assembly Government free breakfast initiative (some charges apply).

Allstars

The After School club and Holiday Club operate under a management committee, and are fee paying.

Sports Provision

When appropriate pupils will be given the opportunity to compete in a variety of sports e.g. rugby, netball, football, and athletics. These may be during school time or after school. All pupils are encouraged to be involved in sports activities as an important part of being healthy, regardless of ability. Girls and boys are encouraged to be involved in all sports.

Swimming

Children are required to receive swimming instruction sometime in years 3 to 6. We ask parents to contribute towards the transport cost, but the instruction is free. I am sure you will agree that it is a very worthwhile activity for your child.

Welsh Second Language Teaching

It is the school policy to encourage children to learn as much as possible the Welsh Language, its history and culture. There has always been a strong Welsh tradition attached to the school through parents and grandparents, who can speak Welsh. We endeavour to include as much of the “Welsh Dimension” as possible through various school activities e.g. Christmas, Assemblies, Eisteddfod etc.

Bilingualism

Each class is taught Welsh on a daily basis. Pupils are encouraged to use the language incidentally throughout the day, and we encourage its use spontaneously in other classroom and school activity settings. Signs and displays around the school promote the use and importance of the Welsh language/culture.

Medicals- Photographs

Medicals- Details will be made available to you prior to any visits made.

Photographs- Individual photographs are taken in the Autumn Term. A class photograph is taken when children start full time education (Reception) and when they leave (Year 6).

Safety First

We have visitors to school from time to time to talk to the children about being safe.

The school has a Health and Safety Policy, which is regularly reviewed. All external doors are locked during school hours. Details of all Health and Safety arrangements are available in school.

Please note for Health and Safety reasons **NO** smoking is allowed on school premises or by the school gates and **NO** dogs are allowed on school premises.

Parents/carers, apart from blue badge holders, must not drive onto the school car park at any time. This applies to parents/carers dropping pupils at breakfast club and picking up from after school club.

The school has external CCTV cameras which monitor the external site.

Severe weather

If we need to close the school due to severe weather, we will send a text alert to parents and put the closure on the Wrexham Council website http://www.wrexham.gov.uk/english/education/school_status.cfm and our own school website <https://maesymynydd.cymru/>

This could be at the start of the day or to close the school part way through the day. Please could you avoid phoning the school unless absolutely necessary in these circumstances as staff are ringing in to let school know if they are able to attend. When there has been overnight snowfall, we make the decision as early as possible as to whether school is open or closed. In the event of severe weather, we may delay the start of the school day in order for us to prepare the school for opening. Our general principle is to open the school whenever possible – we use our knowledge of the school site, the weather forecast and our staff availability to do this. All of these help decide if we open, close or partly open.

Absence

If your child is absent from school, please telephone the school to tell us why and/or inform us in writing when your child returns to school. Any absences not covered by a verbal or written explanation will be recorded as unauthorised. There is an absence answerphone service via the school phone number (01978 832970) or you can email the school: mailbox@maesymynydd-pri.wrexham.sch.uk Text messages are sent out daily for pupils who are absent where no reason has been given.

We meet regularly with the Educational Social Worker to monitor attendance. We would also be grateful if you could inform us if your child has an infectious illness so we can consider the appropriate response from school.

Parents/carers do not have an automatic right to withdraw pupils from school during the school term for a holiday. The Local Authority recommends that no holidays are authorised in term time unless for exceptional circumstances. In exceptional circumstances, a maximum of 10 days leave may be authorised during one academic year. Holiday forms are available from school. Forms must be returned to the school office. You will be informed by email, if the holiday is authorised.

We also ask you to be punctual, the bell rings at 8.50 a.m. and lessons begin at 9.00 a.m. It is important that children do not miss this important time. Please see Appendix 3 for attendance data for 2024/2025

Medication

If a child must receive medication whilst they are at school, there is a form to complete and sign at the school office. A member of staff will administer the medication. Further information is available from school in the Healthcare Policy. Please note: Asthma sufferers using inhalers may do so. Please ensure you complete an asthma registration card, available from school, and return it to the Well-Being Manager, Mrs Jane Hand.

Parents/carers can also purchase plain uniform if they do not wish to have the school logo.

Footwear

For Health and Safety reasons, we encourage all children to wear flat dark coloured footwear. We want all children to grow into healthy adults. We believe that it is dangerous for children to wear shoes that have platform soles or high heels, so we do not allow children to wear such shoes in our school. We also consider flimsy sandals, flip-flops, 'jelly' or foam shoes inappropriate footwear for school.

Physical Development Activities/ P.E.

Physical activity is an important part of school life at Ysgol Maes Y Mynydd, assisting with general health and the wellbeing of young people.

Indoor activities, children are encouraged to wear:

- Black shorts, white T-shirt
- Bare feet for gym and dance

Outdoor games/activities, children are encouraged to wear:

- Black shorts, white T-shirt
- Plimsolls or trainers
- A tracksuit or jogging bottoms may be required in colder weather

Parents/carers are given sufficient notice of any outdoor activity or visit which requires specific items of clothing.

Parents/carers are respectfully asked and regularly reminded to label all items of clothing and footwear. We cannot take responsibility for lost clothing.

Jewellery

For health and safety reasons we do not allow children to wear jewellery in our school including facial piercings. The exceptions to this rule are small stud earrings in pierced ears and watches. We ask the children to remove these during PE and games.

Hairstyles

Extreme hair fashions are inappropriate for school and discouraged. These will be discussed with parents/carers if the need arises. Long hair should be tied back neatly. We ask for the full support of parents/carers regarding this matter.

School Meals

School meals are cooked and served on the premises, catered for by Wrexham School Meals payable online via ParentPay. Further details are available by following this link <https://www.wrexham.gov.uk/service/school-meals/pay-school-meals>

Every full-time pupil (Reception to Year 6) is now entitled to a free school meal as a result of the Welsh Government response to the rising cost of living pressures on families, tackling poverty and ensuring no pupil goes hungry in school. As a result, should you wish your child (ren) to have a school meal can you please order through the ParentPay system by **08.00am** each morning to ensure your child(ren) gets their preferred meal choice. Unfortunately, we cannot guarantee your child (ren) will get their preferred meal choice if not ordered by the correct time.

School Sports

These are held annually in June or July (weather permitting). Children compete for their own house points. Stickers are also awarded. The emphasis is on all pupils taking part and enjoying the event.

Fundraising

We always appreciate the support of parents/carers in our fundraising events. The parent/carer group at Ysgol Maes Y Mynydd will be arranging events to support the school. Please come and join in! If you can help in any way or have any ideas, please come along to the meetings or let us know.


Full details of the procedure may be obtained from the school or from the clerk to the Governing Body.

Ysgol Maes Y Mynydd belongs to the Wrexham Educational Area for administrative purposes and is situated in a semi-urban area. It is one of two primary schools serving the Rhos Community. Part time Nursery education is provided and is integrated with the Reception class in the Foundation Phase. Year 1 and Year 2 pupils are also part of the Foundation Phase. The Key Stage 2 pupils are organised into mixed ability / age classes as appropriate. At the age of 11 plus the children may transfer to Ysgol y Grango / Ysgol Rhiwabon / St. Josephs / Ysgol Morgan Llwyd.
